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Description:-

Pharmacovigilance is a science of collecting, monitoring, researching, assessing and evaluating information from health care providers and patients on the adverse effects of medications, biological products, herbal and traditional medicines with a view to identify new information about hazards associated with medicines preventing harm to patients. This particular "Workshop on concept of Pharmacovigilance for Post Graduate Students" was organized to give basic knowledge of these concepts regarding adverse effects of drugs and the present status of Pharmacovigilance in India and at international level by Institutional Pharmacovigilance Cell of our Institute.

After taking due permission from Principal Hon. Dr. Parag Deshmukhe for this event, the notice was given to all Post Graduate students of our Institute. The workshop was started with Registration of students. Total 28 Post Graduate students were registered for this workshop. After registration process the workshop was started at 11.30 pm. Dr Mahesh Prabhakar Inamdar, the coordinator of Institutional Pharmacovigilance Cell was the Resource person for this workshop. The workshop presentation was divided in three parts-

- i) General introduction of Concept Pharmacovigilance
- ii) Current situation of Pharmacovigilance in India
- iii) Concept of Pharmacovigilance in Ayurveda.

In the first part of presentation the PG students were given information regarding introduction, definition, need of Pharmacovigilance, concept of Adverse Drug Reactions and Adverse Drug Events, and the Governing bodies. The students were also made aware about various Pharmacovigilance centers in India, concepts regarding Pharmacovigilance of medical devices and Herbal medicines. The Resource person Dr Mahesh Inamdar gave information about National Pharmacovigilance programme for ASU drugs. The adequate knowledge regarding ADR Reporting was also given to PG students. Along with Modern medical science information Dr Inamdar sir gave various references in Ayurvedic texts which show similarities with Adverse Drug Reactions. PG students discussed about the need of Pharmacovigilance for Ayurvedic medicines, Herbal dugs, Herbs challenges introducing Drug interactions and the in with Adverse





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Pharmacovigilance in Ayurveda. Question and Answer session was conducted and feedback was taken from Post Graduate students. The workshop was smoothly conducted Dr Mahesh Prabhakar Inamdar.




